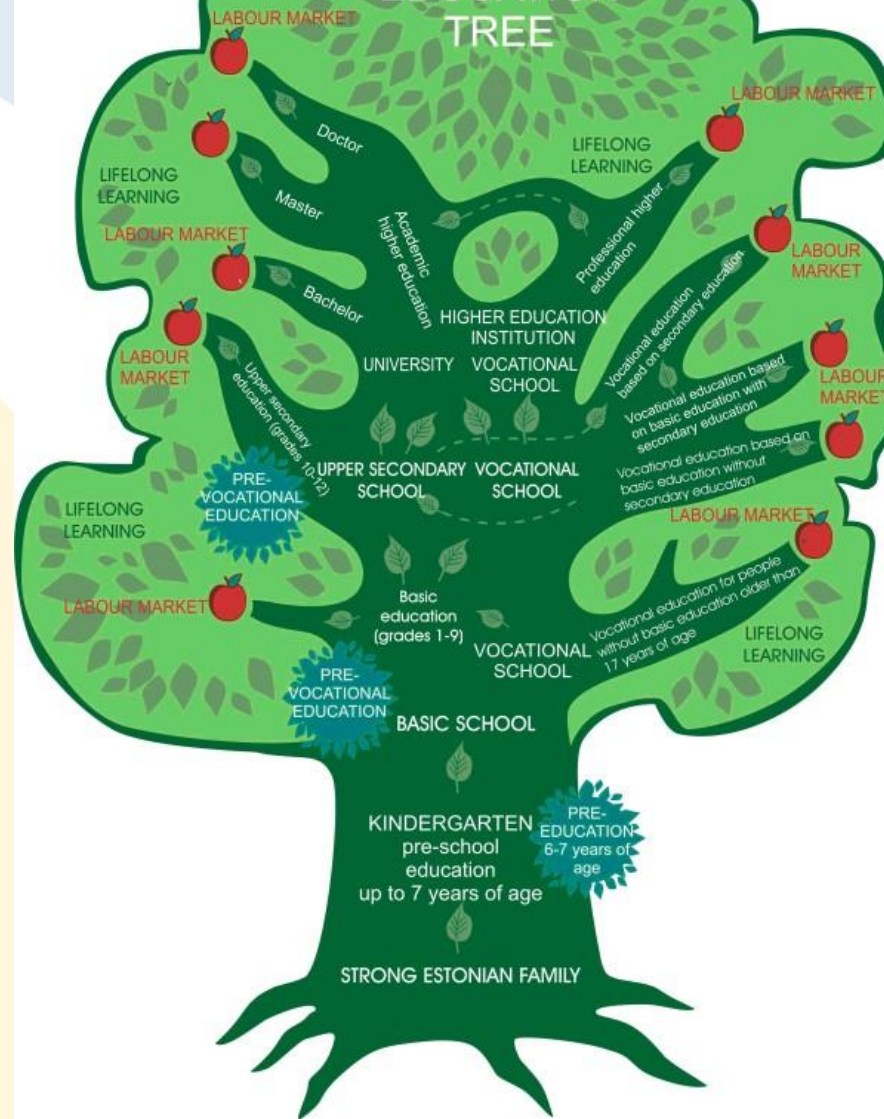

Secondary education

Foundation of Estonian UAS

- Applied (professional) higher education is higher education of the first cycle, the purpose of which is to acquire the competencies necessary for working in a certain profession or for continuing studies at the master's level;
- Today Estonian Rectors' Conference of UAS includes **10** Estonian universities of applied sciences:
 - **2** private institutions;
 - **8** state professional higher education institutions.

Tallinn Health Care College

- Internationally recognized state professional higher education institution offering training in the field of health and well-being;
- One of the two health care colleges in Estonia;
- In Tallinn and Kohtla-Järve;
- Possibility of performing studies in other regional units;
- Rector since 2001 - Ülle Ernits;
- Approximately 1500 students and 140 employees.

- **Vision:** The College is in continuous development, nationally and internationally networked, where, in cooperation with national and international partners and involving learners, current challenges are addressed.

Important Dates

- October 16, 1940 – Tallinn Medical School was founded;
- 2002 – Basic nursing education studies started in Kohtla-Järve Medical School;
- 2005 – Tallinn Medical School became a higher education institution and was renamed Tallinn Health Care College;
- 2006 – Kohtla-Järve Medical School became a structural unit of Tallinn Health Care College;
- 2007 – studies started in Pärnu Hospital.

Accreditations and external evaluations

- 2012 – Institutional Accreditation

The Quality Assessment Council of the Estonian Higher Education Quality Agency decided to accredit the Tallinn Health Care College for seven years.

- 2015 – Accreditation of Vocational Education

- 2016 – Quality Assessment

Programmes of Higher Education

- Basic Nursing Education – 3,5 years
- Nursing Education Specialisation – 1 year
 - Clinical Nursing, Health Nursing, Mental Health Nursing, Intensive Nursing
- Midwife – 4,5 years
 - Double degree: midwife and nurse
- Optometrist – 3,5 years
- Assistant Pharmacist – 3 years
- Dental Technician – 3,5 years
- Health Promotion Specialist – 3 years
- Occupational Therapist – 4 years

Programmes of Vocational Education

- Care Worker – 2 years
- Emergency Medical Technician – 1 year
- Child Minder – 1 year
- Assistive Technology Specialist – 1 year, workplace-based learning
- Sterilisation Technician – 1 year, workplace-based learning
- Worker for Mentally Ill Persons – 1 year, workplace-based learning

Structural Unit in Kohtla-Järve

- Programmes taught in Kohtla-Järve:
 - Nurse;
 - Nursing Education Specialisation – Clinical Nursing;
 - Care Worker.



Pärnu Hospital

- 2007 – studies started in Pärnu Hospital;
- Nursing Education Specialisation programmes (2 years) took place in:
 - 2007/2008
 - 2009/2010
 - 2011/2012
- Basic Nursing Education programme (3,5 years) started in:
 - 2014/2015
 - 2016/2017

Practical Training

- Practical training forms 30-50% of the studies;
- Wide network of practical placements all over Estonia;
- Individual support is provided by the mentor at the practical placement, supervisor at the college and the tutor student.

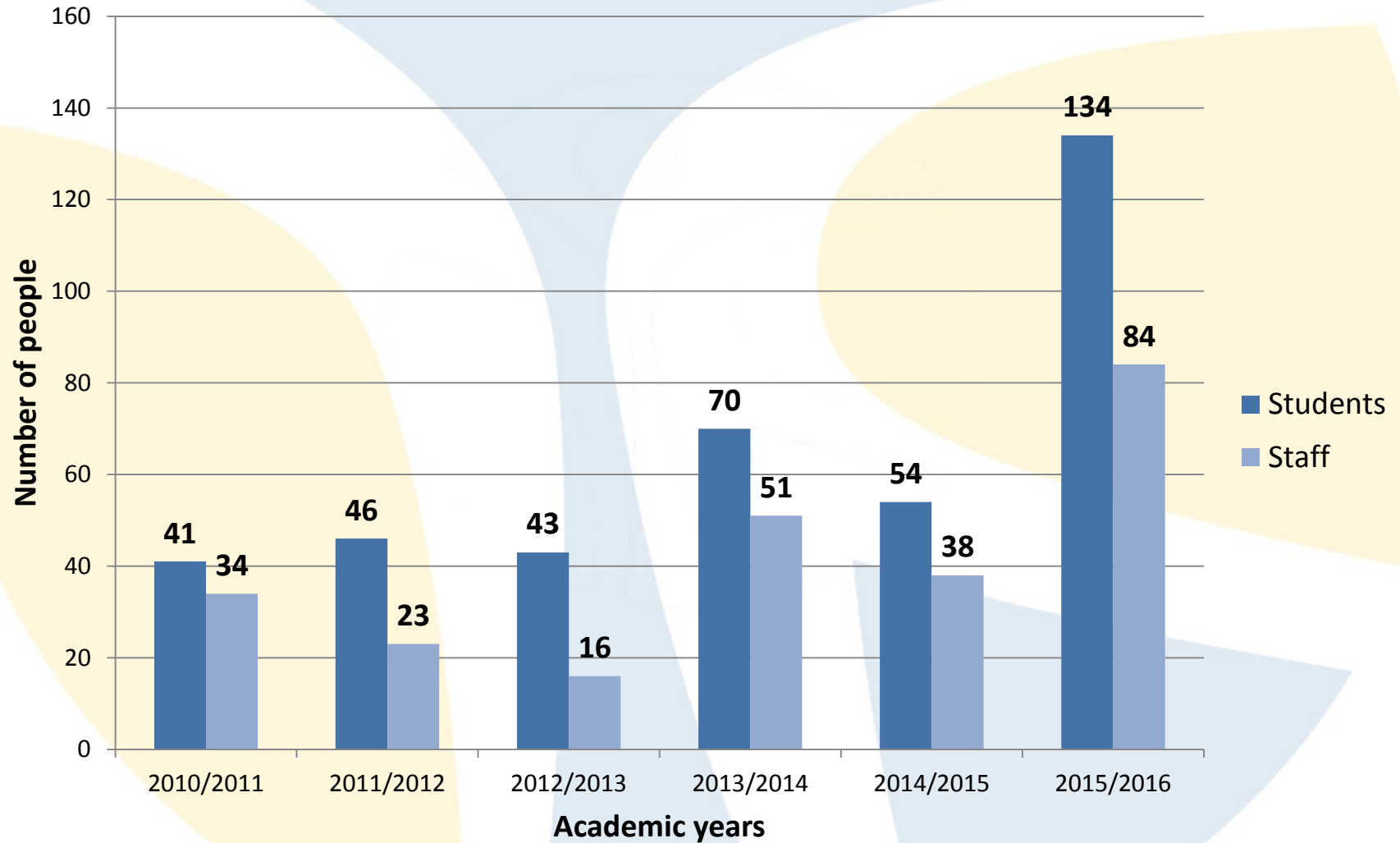

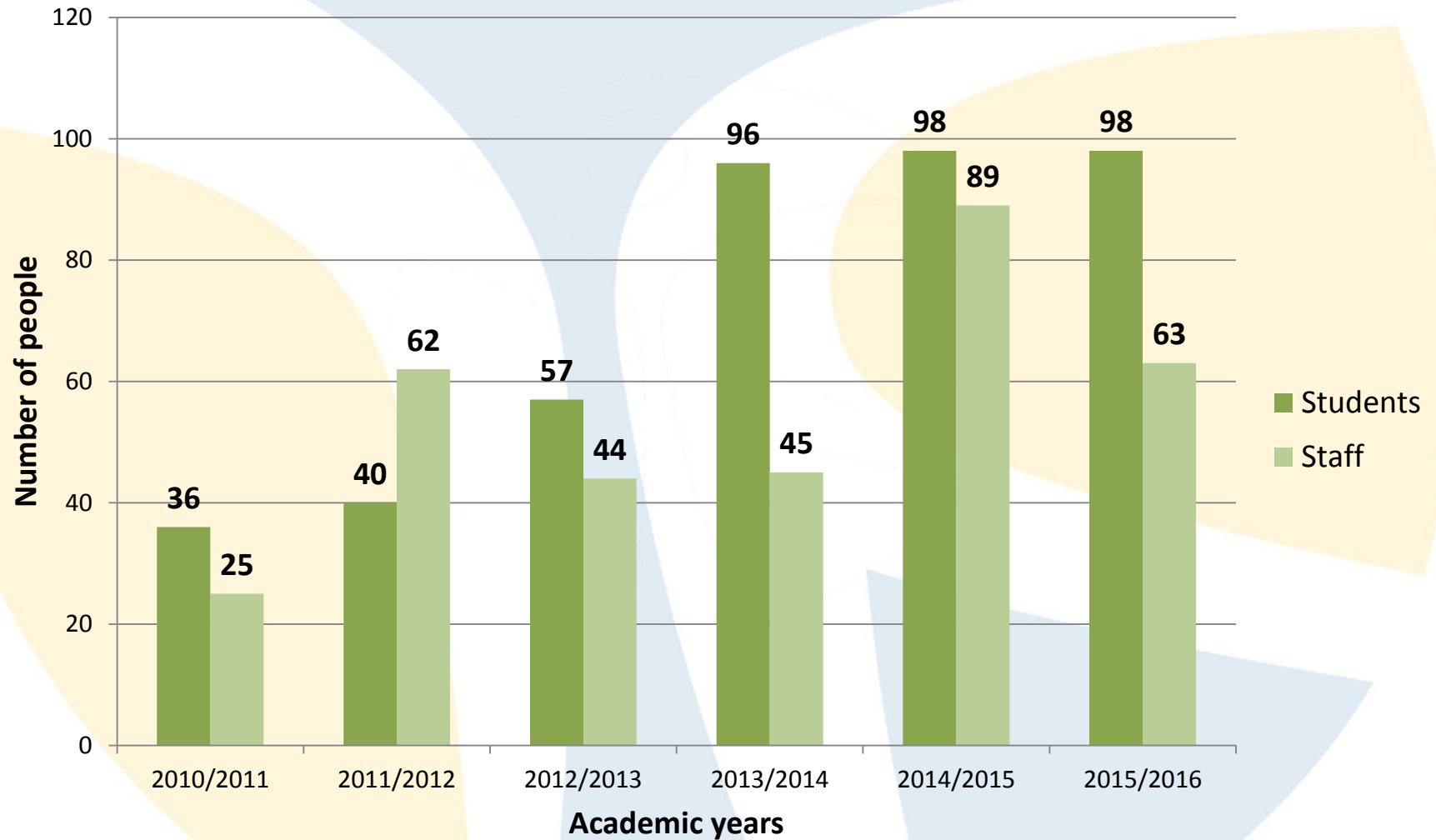

2015/2016
