Providing midwifery care to women by implementing evidence-based knowledge of women's health, public health, sexuality and to advise women on the prevention of diseases on the basis of confidentiality and ethical standards. 2. Acquire the knowledge and skills to diagnose and to determine the risk of pregnancy and fetus. 	
<i>Subjects</i>	Women life span, women rights, abnormal pregnancy, family planning and contraception	
<i>Outcomes</i>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Knows international legislative acts (ICM) concerning women's rights. 2. Knows of human development and bio-psychosocial features and the most common female genital inflammations and genital tumors and associated problems. 3. Knows of modern diagnostic methods of gynecology. 4. Enforce different activity patterns in pregnancy and determine fetal well-being during pregnancy including fetal heart rate. 5. Understand signs, symptoms and indications for referral of selected complications and conditions of pregnancy that affect either mother or foetus (vaginal bleeding; headache, blurred vision, convulsions or loss of consciousness, elevated, blood pressure). 6. Describe diagnostics, medicines and their importance in pregnancy trimesters.

<i>Subjects</i>	Healthy child, Sick child, premature child, critical situations of the process of the delivery, principles of team work.	
<i>Outcomes</i>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Knows of anatomical and physiological features of a child and able to assess the child's growth and development, and the factors influencing them. 2. Describes the child and family-oriented health promotion principles and uses different nursing skills to educate child and family. 3. Knows of neonatal physiology, developmental characteristics, adaptation and is able to care for premature new-born and managing new born problems. 	

	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 4. Knows the most common childhood illnesses, treatments and possible side effects and use different nursing skills to educate the child's mother and family and is able to critically analyse and evaluate the learning process. 5. Determine medical complications in childbirth (Unsatisfactory progress of labor; labor with an over-descended or scarred uterus; fetal distress in labor) 6. Enforce activity in obstetric and neonatal complications and emergencies (shoulder dystocia; prolapsed cord; malposition and malpresentation) 7. Determine medical complications in postpartum care (vaginal bleeding after child birth; fever after childbirth)
